Dear pupils and parents,

We would like to extend a very warm welcome to our new families and say welcome back to our returning children. The children have all returned from the summer holidays with great enthusiasm and have settled into their new year groups and classes. At the start of term we welcomed our new Reception children and a number of in year transfer pupils all of whom have had an amazing start at Grindleford.

School Attendance

The government has made it very clear that all children are expected to attend school full-time. Please see the letter sent out separately outlining the DfE's new guidance and amended laws. Schools are obliged to implement this policy. A critical part of attendance management is ensuring that your child arrives in good time for school and ready to learn. Children who arrive late find this very embarrassing and it disrupts their learning. Please do try to be on time and if you are struggling with this, please contact the school as support may be available.

Doors open at 8.40am and children are expected to be in school for 8.55am.

Please ensure that all absences are reported to the school office by phoning 01433 630528 or via beccy@grindlefordprimaryschool.co.uk. This should happen before 8.30am. If your child is absent and we do not have a message, we are obliged to try to contact you by phone. This is very time consuming and it is really helpful if we know by the start of the day.

Behaviour

We have refreshed our whole school Behaviour Policy and will share this with parents very soon. Grindleford have adopted the following School rules:

School Uniform 2023-2024

This is a polite reminder that we expect children to be dressed in full school uniform. Many of the girls choose to wear leggings instead of tights with their skirts and shorts – which seems sensible and helps to protect knees. Please endeavour to keep these to plain colours (navy blue or black) rather than patterned or brightly coloured.

Please can you check that all items of clothing have your child's name in.

Earrings

Please remember our earrings policy, that no earrings should be worn during any PE lesson. This is standard practice, so please send your child with a little pouch or purse to put their earrings in or don't send them with earrings in on PE and swimming days.

PE DRESS CODE

On PE Days we are asking that children come into school in their PE kits. This saves valuable curriculum time when they can be enjoying more sports. If your child accesses one of the sporting after school clubs (football club or fitness club) please could they have an additional 'sporting type' t-shirt and shorts / leggings in school in a bag that they can change into.

PE days are:

Class 1 Wednesday Class 2 Tuesday and Friday Class 3 Tuesday and Friday

The PE Uniform is:

- a black or blue tracksuit or jogging trousers / leggings
- a blue or black fleece or usual school round neck sweatshirt
- a white / light blue round neck t-shirt (we would prefer a school logo on the t-shirt, especially for sporting events off-site but it is not a requirement)
- navy or black shorts spring / summer only
- trainers or plimsolls ideally in black, navy or grey

Houses

Houses are back this year! The children and staff are excited to reintroduce a way of working across school as a team. All children have been split into houses and we have taken into consideration an even split of age groups in each house, as well as keeping families together. Your child may have been in a hurry to report back which house they are in but if you are in doubt, please ask the class teacher or the school office.

The three houses we have introduced are: **Fitzherbert (red team), Padley (blue team) and Eyre (yellow team)**. These are all local historical names linked to Grindleford's past. We are looking forward to teaching the children about the house names through our local history lessons, as well as encouraging teamwork across the school.
