Our next Bag2School collection has been arranged for Tuesday 29th April 2025. Not only is this a fundraising opportunity but also brings a number of environmental benefits. It saves water, materials and energy compared to creating new clothes. It also keeps clothes out of landfill sites and incinerators.

#### Attendance

Pupils need to attend school regularly to benefit from their education. Missing out on lessons leaves children vulnerable to falling behind. Statistics show that children with poor attendance tend to achieve less in both primary and secondary school.

School is obliged to fine parents who take term time holidays totalling more than 5 days in a rolling 10-week period. Derbyshire County Council will not issue more than 2 fines in a 3-year period.
